

THE CHALLENGE

California's homeless crisis is complex, but some cities are taking action. Sacramento's new 175-unit Stockton Avenue Safe Stay Community offers shelter, food, health services, job placement, and housing aid at 6810 Stockton Blvd. Completed in five months, it opened in December 2024. A unique feature: approved residents can bring their pets. The project, a collaboration between California, contractor SJ Amoroso, and subcontractors, aims to help residents become self-sufficient and transition into permanent housing.

THE SOLUTION

To complement the 175 separate "tiny sleeping (modular) cabins" (most are 8' x 9') provided by another manufacturer, Mobile Modular constructed the following custom buildings using "Human-Centered Design" (HCD) which is briefly described as creating spaces that are intuitive and useful to a diverse range of people:

- Two 12' x 60' bathroom buildings
- One 36' x 40' cafeteria
- One 24' x 60' management building
- One 36' x 60' administration building
- One 12' x 40' laundry building
